Overview

The Black Codhers Software Engineer Front End skills bootcamp, includes HTML, CSS, JavaScript and React programming.

You will also get a chance to take part in projects to put your skills to the test.

Additionally this course gives you career support to prepare you for interviews and a career in technology after the course, in a number of junior tech and security roles.

What will I learn on this skills bootcamp?

You will learn the fundamentals of front-end development including version control and using the Command Line.

You will get a chance to use the skills you learn in practical labs and also a final 2week commercial project.

We will also prepare you and support you to get a new career in the technology industry, through supporting your personal development.

Modules covered

Modules you will learn:

- Version control and Command Line
- Introduction to HTML and CSS
- Introduction to programming with JavaScript
- Using Front-end Framework
- Group project
- Career preparation

How is the Skills Bootcamp delivered?

This is a part-time 16-week programme, with 13 weeks of course content, which includes two evenings a week of guided learning plus self-learning, followed by three weeks of a group project, which is delivered remotely in the evenings.

Am I eligible to take part?

The course is fully funded and open to residents of the North West aged 19 or over, who are either in-work, looking for work, or have been unemployed for 12 months or less.

In addition to this, you must be a black female as Black Codhers courses are all run with the purpose of getting more black women into technology careers.
